

PRE-PURCHASE (PPE) EXAMINATION CONSENT FORM

- A telephone call with our booking staff is mandatory prior to the pre-purchase examination
- It is important to understand the expectations of the buyer and purpose of the horse, as well as to discuss budget (imaging) to avoid any pitfalls.
- A passport needs to be presented at the time of the examination without exception.
- The invoice needs to be paid by the potential buyer unless agreed otherwise with the seller.
- The individual requesting the PPE and the seller must sign the Seller's Permission Form for full examination, blood collection and sedation. Regardless of the temperament of the horse, if radiographic/ultrasonographic examination is requested, the horse might be sedated (doping test positive for 4 days)

Practical but mandatory requirements:

- The horse should be on full work for the past 5 days.
- Proper trimming and shoeing are required. A minimum of 3 days post trimming or shoeing is recommended to avoid gait abnormalities misinterpretation.
- If the requirements are not fulfilled, the exam will have to be rescheduled (transport at owner's expenses).
